### **April Forum Justice and Righteousness: Voting Rights**

John Nichols gave an extensive and enlightening talk on our state's voting situation, covering our democracy and the influences, changes, pressures, developments that have affected it from earliest days until today. And looking forward to what we can do as we go forward into tomorrow. We weren't founded on democracy. White slaveholders were the major force in our founding, the ones in the room. Limited participation, with no women, no slaves, no indentured servants. Only 20% of people voted.

Our progress toward democracy has taken quite a while. We still had a poll tax until the mid 1960's. We still have work to do.

This is just the start of John's talk and discussion. The good news is that you can hear it for yourself by going to our website, where you will find a tape of his talk. The talk itself took about 30 minutes, but you can also get the questions and discussions that followed. It makes for a well-used hour of your time. If you weren't able to attend April's forum, do go to our web site and hear it for yourself.

It was a long struggle to let everyone in. Debtor barriers, religious barriers, wealth barriers came down, but still it was just white men who voted. Civil War led to votes by blacks, immense effort led to Women's, and Native Americans in the 1920's. Still it was the 1950's and '60's before the 1964 Civil Rights Act, the poll tax overturned. Religious leaders Jewish, Muslim, Christian worked for voting rights. In the 1970's, 18-21 year olds got the right to vote. We are close to a universal franchise.

But since then, powerful forces have made it harder to vote. Gerrymandering, an effort to undo voting rights, new efforts to overturn elections, make it harder to vote, make it easier to overturn elections. After 230 years, is the arc of history bending back? Church groups Christian, Jewish, Muslim see it as a moral duty to ensure democracy is REAL, that power reflects the will of the people.

This expansion, from 1787 when it was just white men of privilege, to all people have the right to vote took a while. We put it in moral terms. Basically, we are all human beings, and all must be able cast votes. Basic premise: All are able to participate, to have their votes counted.

This is just the beginning of John Nichols' discussion. It is well worth watching again, if you took part in last months' meeting. Be heartened by his noting that women over 30 are the best voters, especially black women who are outstanding. Older folks are good voters, older women are excellent voters.

And if you were not there on Zoom, it is definitely something you want to watch and expand your knowledge of where we've been and what our challenges are today.
