#### **Solving the Climate Crisis**

Our October meeting featuring Bob Lindmeier was an enormous successful look at Climate Change and our challenge to meet this looming crisis head-on. Bob, longtime meteorologist at WKOW, wants all of us involved in the climate change crisis because it is real, dangerous, and immediate. 97 percent of scientists believe that climate change is real. We all need to work on solutions, because it is accelerating at a rapid pace and time is precious.

Scientists have reached back 800,000 years to air bubbles in extremely old ice to know what carbon was in the air then. Skyrocketing carbon over the last hundred years is scary not only for magnitude but also rapidity.

The 10 hottest years are recent, changes are advancing, and we must hold climate change to 1.5 degrees.

Climate change leads to more algae in lakes, more Lyme disease, more mosquito time, longer growing season now 30 days longer than 50 years ago. We have to decrease greenhouse gases. It depends on us.

Bob brought charts, statistics, graphs, impressive figures. It was an overwhelming look at this problem.

And we must tackle the challenge for the sake of our kids and grandkids. Reduce carbon footprint. Electricity for cars. Stop burning fossil fuels. Look to wind, solar power. Inflation Reduction Act. Carbon Dividend Act. Net zero by 2050. 30% reduction in 5 years.

Climate Restoration requires us to use tech to direct air cleansing, convert land fill, use garbage for aviation fuel.

We're doing big things. Show the world the US is willing to take action. Talk about climate change. Vote for climate change. IT IS UP TO US! Wisconsin Climate Care. Citizens Climate Lobby

We are down to 21 member churches and 15 key women. This is an excellent opportunity to get more women involved with us. So invite your friends, and their pastors. World Day of Prayer is an opportunity to spread the word.
