THEME

Church Women United's national theme for 2023 is "Living a Legacy of Love Doing God's Work" with the supplementing anchor scripture citation of—Ephesians 2:10 NIV "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." As evidenced with the mission outreach within respective local communities of Women of Church Women United, Inc., the directive and spiritual legacy of Christ Jesus' message of loving others, continues no matter the ethnicity, socioeconomic status, education level, etc. of individuals. Though it is quite easy to give a firm handshake or embrace someone, and then articulate the words, 'I love you', yet, God has given His handiwork people His Holy Spirit so they can Labor with Love with emphasis on Respect to Heal for 2023 Human Rights Day Celebration that is— "Do to others as you would have them do to you." Luke 6:31 NIV.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Human Rights Day celebrates the day the General Assembly of the United Nations adopted and proclaimed the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) on December 10, 1948 in reaction to heinous acts perpetrated during World War II. At that historic event, Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, the first Chair of the United Nation's Council of Human Rights, discussed the importance of recognizing Universal Human Rights for all people. During her speech, she said: "We must want our fellow human beings to have rights and freedoms which give them dignity and which will give them a sense that they are human beings that can walk the earth with their heads held high and look all men in the face." Within the UDHR are thirty Articles supporting an individual's rights from their birth to their death. It is apropos that Human Rights Day is annually celebrated in remembrance that dignity, respect, and utmost value are afforded every human being.
