STATE CWU BOOK PROJECT

"Journeys Out of Homelessness the Voices of Lived Experience" by Jamie Rife and Donald W. Burns.

The first book will be read in its entirety in preparation for the CWU BOOK MEET. The second book, although you may wish to read it in its entirety, the focus at the CWU BOOK MEET will be on the individual stories: "Barb's Story," pp.19-32; "Tim's Story", pp.33-44; "Marie's Story, pp. 45-67; "Tiffany's Story", pp. 69-85; "Blizzard's Story", pp. 87-103; "Leanne's Story", pp. 105-134; "James's Story", pp. 135-144; "Caroline's Journey", pp. 145-185.


