The President's Corner



May Friendship Day began in May 1933. The Women's Council for Home Missions in New York City and the National Council of Federated Church Women planned luncheons to focus on "Child Health", "Children of migrant Families", and "Dedication Day-Focusing on Unity". Under a variety of names these events continued until in 1939, the two groups merged under the National Council of Church Women. Th NCCW called for an annual celebration "to strengthen a growing sense of unity, the joy of Christian Fellowship, and the power of Christianity in the day of need". In May 1945, a few years after the founding of Church Women United, the Celebration was formalized as "May Fellowship Day". In 1999, Church Women United changed the name of the celebration to "May Friendship Day".

As we focus our attention, today, on some of the World's worst humanitarian crises, we can reflect on the founders of May Friendship Day and their understanding of the "power of Christianity in the day of need"..."concern for community and unity". Here are a few places of concern.

Syria – What began as a peaceful protest in 2011, has now become more than a decade of humanitarian suffering, the violence continues, as millions of Syrians are displaced, due to civil war since the Arab Spring protests in 2011 and more recently the 2023 Earthquake.

Democratic Republic of Congo (formerly known as Zaire) – Continued outbreaks of armed conflict often triggered by disputes over land, natural resources, and ethnic disputes, the scene for one of the worst-ever civil wars in African History, the conflict has moved from the national conflict to a series of smaller, localized conflicts, focused in specific regions, and focused on land, resources, and power. DNC is the country with the most displaced people in the world, 5.5 million. DNC is one of the world's poorest countries but has one of the largest reserves of potential wealth. Famine, disease, lack of clean water, lack of electricity, roads, lack of investment, and a displaced citizenry are all factors in making DNC one of the worst humanitarian crises in the world.

Ukraine- Lives in danger and infrastructure destroyed.

Haiti-Expanding gang violence in an increasingly fragile country.

Myanmar-Escalating conflicts are increasing humanitarian needs, along with extreme weather events, wildfires, and floods.

Palestine- Forced displacement and famine risk.

***The greeting, salutation and response:** led by Carolyn Rumph. The prayer for peace was led by Carolyn. Jenny Armstrong led us in singing, "God of Peace" from our songbook handout. Carolyn led us in the Call to Worship and Responsive Reading. Carolyn led us in the Gospel Reading, John 15: 12-13, 17.

*<u>The Story of Eleanor</u> – read by Margaret, a member of the CS church.

*Epistle Reading – Carolyn Rumph Ephesians 4: 1-3.

*Sermon and Bible Study led by Sandy, a CS member.

***Song,** "I Urge You," led by Jenny Armstrong and the CWU choir.

*Lina's Story – a truth-telling story read by Marge, a CS member.

*Hymn – "We walk by the Light of the Word"

***Prayers** – After each prayer was read, the people responded, "Hear Our Prayer."

*The Lord's Prayer – sung in Aramaic, the language of Jesus.

*Sarah's Story – a story of flourishing, read by an audience member.

***The Offering** – Bible Reading, 2ND Corinthians 8:12-15.

Special collection for Fellowship of the Least Coin: The Fellowship of the Least Coin dates back to 1956 when Shanti Solomen, from India, traveled throughout Asia with an international mission team, led by Presbyterian women. These seven women found many injustices done to women during World War II. Shanti challenged Christian women to pray for justice, peace and reconciliation with a coin, the least of their currency. We collect pennies all year and bring a check of the total to our May Friendship Celebration on May 10, 2024. These checks are sent to an office in Atlanta, GA and given via grants to needy women and children around the world. <u>The checks must be made out to Church Women United, with FLC in the memo section of the check</u>.
