#### **October Forum**

Once again we will meet via Zoom on October 2 at 10 am. Ms Pia Kinney will be present on Zoom (see the link) to discuss her chapter in the *Nine African American Families: Their Memories and Reflections*. A group of women in Madison decided to study their family genealogy and support one another over time as they did this. They met regularly and would share their progress, and they met for over 6 years. There were challenges and dead ends, and the support of the small group of women was key to invigorate the lengthy process. I see this as a sacred process of love and respect of their ancestors with documentation, and witness.

Then they decided to pull together some of their stories into a precious book, which they self-published. They paid for one to be placed in each of the Madison Public Libraries. Pia Kinney agreed to accept our invitation last year (before COVID) to come to a CWU-Madison Forum, and respond to questions by our participants. She will be with us on Zoom on Friday morning 10-11:30. The co-hosts will be CWU-Madison Board Members Shirley Alexander, Carolyn Rumpf, and Lynn McDonald. You can also order Dr Muriel Simms recent book *'Settlin' Stories of Madison's Early African American Families'* (2018) Wisconsin Historical Society. This book also has a chapter on Pia Kinney James. This is a wonderful book, and I highly recommend that you purchase it and read it all.

These personal stories of living Black in Madison are particularly relevant to share with all of us now, and to discuss together, since the murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis in May, and Jacob Blake in Kenosha in August. All of us are witness of the police brutality of these murders, and we join in support of the protests of systemic racism in our city, our state and our country. Despite COVID pandemic causing us who are of a certain age to stay safe at home and to wear masks and to socially distance, we are all involved in other ways. We are engaged in learning more and more and reading and joining forums to further reveal the lies about race and the social impact of the evil roots of slavery in our country since 400 years ago.
